DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Peter Shaffer's AMADEUS (1979) – originally titled "Salieri" in an early draft – is regarded as one of the finest stage plays of the late 20th century. It is best known in the form of its Oscar award-winning film (1984) which garnered acclaim for F. Murray Abraham as Salieri, Tom Hulce as Mozart, Miloš Forman as Director, and Shaffer as Screenwriter, who adapted the material from his seminal play. **The film won 8 Academy Awards including Best Picture**. News of the movie's 40th anniversary, in fact, piqued our interest in reviving this masterpiece.

Theater people know that the stage play is just as artistically ambitious as as the cinematic masterpiece. Theatricality oozes from the play – with our narrator Salieri speaking directly to the audience throughout the play and the clever gossip-mongers (**The Venticelli** or "Little Winds") updating us on the latest news of Vienna as the epic saga takes place in famous Viennese locations, from the palatial **Schonbrunn Palace** to the city park called **The Prater** to a collection of **Opera Houses** in the famous city of musicians.

Numerous pairs of actors have graced the stage as Salieri and Mozart: Paul Scofield and SimonCallow (1979), Ian McKellen and Tim Curry (1980), Frank Langella and Mark Hamill (1983), David Suchet and Michael Sheen (1998), and most recently Lucien Msamati and Adam Gillen (2017).

Here in Wichita, Shaun-Michael Morse – tonight's Emperor Joseph II – played the role of Mozart at Wichita Center for the Arts in the early 1990s, directed by Sharla Michaels. In our collective recollections, that is the only time AMADEUS has ever been produced in Wichita outside of collegiate arenas.

Why is such an amazing play so rarely performed? It is a massive, literarily intense play, and the incredibly demanding roles of Salieri and Mozart make it especially challenging to produce. In my early conversations with Lyle Valentine and Cody Proctor, we agreed that it is both thrilling and terrifying to take on a project which at times feels beyond our capacities. But the experience has been simply unforgettable, and I hope your experience as an audience member is vibrant and moving.

We are grateful to partner with WSU's Voice and Opera Theater program under the direction of Alan Held to bring live musicians to the stage tonight! AMADEUS was written to use recorded sound, but from time to time directors have made use of live musicians. Working with this group of singers has been a delight. On behalf of them, our cast of eleven, and the whole creative team, we urge you to invite other Wichitans to experience AMADEUS live on stage.

ARTISTIC TEAM



DR. JULIE LONGHOFER, Artistic Director

(Director, Costume & Scenic Designer)

Julie earned her MA/PhD in dramatic literature & theater history from University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign in 1995. For almost 40 years, she has served as stage director, costume designer, actor, and dramaturg (literary analyst). Julie has taught hundreds of teenagers and college students how to be stronger theater artists.

In 2023, Julie took on the role of Artistic Director for Wichita Repertory Theater (ICTRep). Her vision is for a regional theater company which (1) finds the best comedies, serious plays and thrillers of literary merit, (2) uses regional talent to produce the highest quality plays in terms of acting and production values, and (3) connects deeply with Wichita audience members from all walks of life.

This is her philosophical approach in all she does:

- Live theater is a love letter from The Playwright to The Actors for The Audience.
- Live theater should be a cohesive and thought-provoking experience for its community.
- "Dramatically Good" is more than just a tagline for us. Our creative teams are doing their best work while challenging themselves to a new level of artistic excellence so that our audiences are emotionally moved in a memorable way.



DR. STAN LONGHOFER, Managing Director

(Technical Director; Scenic Design)

As Managing Director, Stan oversees all of ICTRep's business operations. He is also the company's resident technical director and frequent lighting and scenic designer. By day, Stan is a professor of real estate and finance at WSU. He was Director of the WSU Center for Real Estate for 25 years. On weekends and

evenings, he has variously served as psychotherapist and cheerleader on dozens of Julie's productions.

In 2023, Stan finally convinced his wife to take a leap of faith into running a theater company. "We took the reins at ICTRep because we saw a need in Wichita for great plays produced at the highest levels of excellence. Several amateur theaters are well established here, as are other semi-professional companies focused on musicals. But there was a professional void when it came to plays."

As a lifelong lover and participant in the Wichita theatre scene, a much younger Stan "trod the boards" at the Crown Uptown Dinner Theater, Wichita Children's Theatre and Music Theatre Wichita. He met his wife in Wilner Auditorium while a Theater major at WSU, asking her out when they crossed paths at an experimental Samuel Beckett play. (She said no. He didn't give up. The rest is history.)



ALAN HELD (Music Director)

Professor Alan Held, is the Director of Opera and Area Coordinator of Voice at Wichita State University where he is the Ann and Dennis Ross Faculty of Distinction in Opera. "One of the leading singing-actors today", Professor Held is in his 40th year on the international stage and has appeared in leading and title roles with The Metropolitan Opera (nearly 200 performances), The Vienna State Opera, The Royal Opera Covent Garden, The Paris Opera, The

Bavarian State Opera, and many others. His repertoire includes over 80 roles. He has appeared and recorded with the world's leading orchestras including The Berlin Philharmonic, The Chicago Symphony Orchestra, The Cleveland Orchestra, and The Philadelphia Orchestra. He has worked with nearly every noted conductor and stage director of the last four decades. A noted clinician, Mr. Held has given masterclasses and private sessions at Yale University, The University of Notre Dame, Wolf Trap Opera, and The Ryan Opera Center (Lyric Opera of Chicago). He has twice served as The Artist in Residence at The Washington National Opera at The Kennedy Center. Mr. Held received his bachelor's degree from Millikin University (where he was honored with an Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters). He received his master's degree from Wichita State University. He is also, currently, the Director of Sacred Music for the Catholic Diocese of Wichita, Kansas and serves on the voice faculty at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.



DR. JUDITH LYNN STILLMAN (Music Arranger)

Dr. Judith Lynn Stillman is Artist-in-Residence and Professor of Music at Rhode Island College and holds Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral degrees from The Juilliard School. She served as Musical Director, Pianist, Score Designer, Composer/Arranger, and Lyricist for The Gamm Theatre's *Amadeus* (2024) and has directed music for Trinity Repertory Theatre, American Repertory Theatre, Operafestival di Roma, and more. She has performed at

Tanglewood, Marlboro, Grand Teton Festival, Carnegie Hall, the GRAMMY's celebration honoring Rostropovich, and world premieres at Lincoln Center. Her recordings include a Billboard Top Ten Sony duet album with Wynton Marsalis. She has collaborated with Oskar Eustis, Kate Burton, Will Liverman, Jordan Rudess, Mark O'Connor, Shanghai, Borromeo, Lydian, and Cassatt Quartets, members of the NY Philharmonic, the LA Philharmonic and the Boston Symphony, and The Beach Boys. A visiting guest artist at Beijing's Central Conservatory, Prague Conservatory, and the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, she is an award-winning pianist and composer, and Honored Artist of The American Prize. judithlynnstillman.com



DR. WARREN KIM (Piano)

Dr. Warren Kim, Assistant Teaching Professor of Piano at Wichita State University, holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in piano performance with a minor in pedagogy. He teaches applied lessons, piano literature, repertoire, and collaborative piano, while also serving as adjudicator for competitions nationally and internationally, including Taiwan's International Piano Performance Examinations Committee and state festivals. A versatile performer,

he has appeared as soloist, collaborator, and chamber musician across North America and Asia, with artist-in residencies and festival invitations worldwide, and continues to perform with professors from prestigious universities. Beyond performance and teaching, Dr. Kim has led church music programs, organized fundraising concerts, and earned The President's Volunteer Service Award.



PETER SHAFFER (Playwright)

Sir Peter Shaffer, in full, Sir Peter Levin Shaffer (1926-2016), was a British playwright of considerable range who moved easily from farce to the portrayal of human anguish.

Educated at St. Paul's and Trinity College, Cambridge, Shaffer first worked for a music publisher and then as a book reviewer. His first play, *Five-Finger Exercise* (1960), is a tautly constructed domestic

drama that almost overnight established his reputation as a playwright. It was followed by *The Private Ear, The Public Eye* (both 1962), and *The Royal Hunt of the Sun* (1964), a portrayal of the conflict between the Spanish and the Inca – "hope and hopelessness, faithlessness and faith." In 1965 Shaffer's adroit farce Black Comedy was first performed. *Equus* (1973; filmed 1977), dealing with a mentally disturbed stableboy's obsession with horses, and *Amadeus* (1979; filmed 1984), about the rivalry between Mozart and his fellow composer Antonio Salieri, were successes with both critics and the public. Later plays include the biblical epic *Yonadab* (1985), *Lettice and Lovage* (1987) and *The Gift of the Gorgon* (1992). Shaffer was knighted in 2001.



JAMISON RHOADS (Lighting Designer)

Jamison Rhoads is an Assistant Professor of Design and Technical Theatre at Wichita State University. Jamison graduated from the School of Performing Arts at WSU in 1996 with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre Performance. Jamison holds an MFA in Design from Temple University in Philadelphia and studied lighting at the Juilliard School in New York City. A lifelong theatre professional, Jamison has designed over 200 productions for both professional

and educational institutions, including ICTRep's 2024 production of *The Old Man and the Old Moon*. Jamison is married to the love of his life fellow Wichitan, Kate Rhoads. Together they have a sweet four-year-old daughter named Stella.



KIRK LONGHOFER (Sound Designer)

Kirk is a sound designer, editor, producer, and live sound. His theatrical designs are heard regularly in educational, community, and professional theaters across the country. Recent theatrical work includes the world premiere of *Tree of Life* and *Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time*, (White Theatre at the J, Overland Park), *Travesties, Ms. Holmes & Ms. Watson, Apt.2B* and *Sleuth* (ICTRep), *Blithe Spirit* (Guild Hall Players), and *Proof* (Olathe

Civic Theatre Association).



TOREY WILSON (Assistant Director & Stage Manager)
Torey Wilson is a local actor and director here in Wichita. He is excited to return to the ICTRep family. 
